to celebrate the lighting of The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Beacons Thursday June 2nd 2022

To announce the lighting of The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Beacons and as a tribute to Her Majesty, **A Song for the**Commonwealth has been commissioned via a worldwide competition.

The longstanding tradition of lighting beacons to mark royal celebrations will be even more significant this year, with hundreds of choirs singing from all over the UK in harmony with choirs from throughout the 54 Commonwealth countries.

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee is a unique milestone celebrating Her Majesty's 70th year as Monarch and Head of the Commonwealth.



What's going to happen?

On June 2nd at precisely the same time as beacons are lit on the first evening of the 4-day Jubilee Weekend, thousands of choirs throughout the UK and around the world will sing the Song for the Commonwealth - *A Life Lived with Grace* - filling the world with music and song in celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

The Lighting of the Beacons and the Song for the Commonwealth will take place at 21.45 p.m. in the UK and 21.15 p.m. in the rest of the Commonwealth

A Life Lived with Grace was written by Lucy Kiely from Australia (lyrics) and Vincent Atueyi Chinemelu from Nigeria (music)

Schedule for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations on Thursday 2nd June 2022



- **2.00 p.m.** Proclamation, heralding the lighting of the beacons announced by hundreds of town criers and 50 Pearly Kings and Queens
 - **21.35 p.m.** Traditional and Northumbrian pipers and pipe bands will play *Diu Regnare*, a unique tune specially composed for the occasion by Pipe Major Stuart Liddell, the world's leading piper.
- **21.40 p.m.** Buglers linked to local beacon lightings officially announce the lighting of the beacons with a specially written call, entitled *Majesty*.
- At 21.45 p.m. in the UK and 21.15 p.m. in all other countries, to coincide with the lighting of the beacons, choirs across all nations will sing A Song for the Commonwealth.
